Big Block Hexagon Quilt: 50" x 59" Workshop with Debby Kratovil



Are you looking for a creative way to use a stack of 10" squares? Often referred to as Layer Cakes (yum, yum), we often wish there was some icing to go along with them, right? 32 squares (plus some light background fabric) will make this Big Block Hexagon quilt. We cut our hexagons – and setting triangles - with a multi-sized 60 degree triangle ruler (included in the kit fee). (If you have your own 60-degree ruler, bring it to class and Debby will rebate you the price of her ruler).

Fabric Supplies (wof – width of fabric, usually 40-42")

- At least 32 squares 10" x 10" (these will be cut down for the large hexagons)
- OR 32 rectangles cut 7-1/2" x 10". The more prints, the better.
- 1-1/4 yard background fabric (light print or solid)
- 1 yard border print (this can be two prints as in my sample or a single fabric). If you wish to NOT have to piece the borders, you will need 1-3/4" of a single cut. (Borders are cut 6".)
- ½ yard for binding

Pre-cutting before class:

- At least one 4" x wof strip of light background fabric (we'll cut more in class)
- One strip 11" x wof of light background fabric (for large side triangles; will cut with ruler in class)
- If you are using a Layer Cake (ie, stack of 10" squares), pre-cut them into 7-1/2" x 10" rectangles. These will be cut into hexagons IN CLASS.

Kit includes multi-page, well illustrated instructions and 60 degree triangle ruler with an 8.5" height.
